

MICHAEL O'HIGGINS

Michael O'Higgins came to the United States in the fall of 1946. He had been professor of singing at the Royal Irish Academy of Music in Dublin, to which post he was appointed in 1939. His pupils became widely known, and so did he, as a singer, following concerts in England, Scotland and Wales, as well as in his own country. He resigned his post at the Academy a couple of years ago to devote more of his time to his concerts. His first appearance in this country was at Symphony Hall, Boston, for the Archbishop Cushing Charity Fund. Boston critics hailed him on his American debut, the Boston Post saying, for example: "A rewarding artist, by reason of the rare beauty of his voice and his ability to communicate the intention of the poet and composer." Great Britain's music reviewers have called him the greatest baritone of this generation. Succeeding concerts have been in Town Hall, New York City; in Washington, D. C.; in Boston again, and other major cities. This October he was heard at the Alice Meynell Memorial in Boston, a city that had apparently taken the Irish singer to its heart. Last year he was heard at the Marymount College Auditorium in Tarrytown, and this is thus his second visit to Westchester. It is his farewell recital in New York. also, for he returns to Ireland in a few months to take up the post of director of music at Hardebeck House, the College of Arts, in Dublin.


